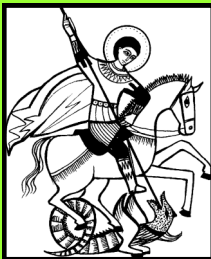

Thy Kingdom Come is a global movement, which invites Christians around the world to pray between Ascension and Pentecost for more people to come to know Jesus Christ. Cardinal Vincent Nichols encourages us to take part in our local events. These can be found on onevoicework.org.uk and click on Thy Kingdom Come. One of these services takes place at Our Lady's Church Acomb, 6pm Monday 14 May and the Beacon Event will be at York Minster on Pentecost Sunday, 20 May at 7.30pm. All very welcome to all events.

Ecumenical Bible Study: The letters to the Christians at Thessalonica are thought to be the oldest letters in the New Testament perhaps written just 20 years after the events of Easter and Pentecost. In them St Paul addresses the concerns of an early community who hold a firm expectation of the second coming of Christ within their lifetime, 'the times and dates', whilst suffering persecution for their acceptance of the apostolic preaching. We will read the letters over 4 one hour sessions beginning on Thursday 17 May starting at 7pm at The Carmelite Convent 110 Lawrence Street. Bring a bible, any edition.

School Volunteers - opportunities from CAFOD: Children and young people have a keen sense of justice. School volunteers inform and inspire them, helping them to turn their passion for justice into real action. Full training will be provided. You will need to apply for a DBS certificate.

What will you be doing?

- Visiting local schools to deliver assemblies and interactive classroom sessions.
- Building positive relationships with an agreed number of schools, encouraging them to book further visits and to act with CAFOD for a fairer world.
- Preparing for visits using materials such as PowerPoint presentations, posters and activity ideas provided by CAFOD.
- Completing a short feedback form after every visit.

We are looking for people with the following skills:

- Ability to communicate well with children and young people in large assembly settings and smaller class groups.
- An ability to use technology to deliver presentations (digital projector, laptop, PowerPoint) or be willing to learn.
- Be comfortable using email and accessing a website to find information.

How much time will I need?

- On average, you will make one visit a month (about four hours including preparation and travel), but our programme is busiest around the times of CAFOD Fast Days—late Sept/early Oct and during Lent.
- You should be prepared to travel to local schools during school hours.
