

ST GEORGE'S MILLENNIUM PARISH MAP

The Church's Year of Jubilee, 2000, was the 150th anniversary of the opening of St George's Church in 1850. Inspired by the visit to York of the Quaker Tapestry the idea for a tapestry to mark St George's anniversary began to take shape. Many parishioners stitched figures or scenes to illustrate the many events so important in the development of the parish and a small group met regularly to assemble the tapestry.

The panels are framed in 'arches' of ashlar walling to represent the City Walls within which the church is built.

The shields at the foot of each stone arch signify from left to right:

- The Palmes family
- The Cox family
- The Dolman family (all benefactors of the church)
- The Bishop of Beverley
- St George's Primary School
- The shield of St George, the Patron of the parish.
