Update on arrangements for Mass

A new month brings a new schedule of Holy Masses at St Georges. It's great to see more parishioners and visitors to York feeling able to attend Mass. Sunday morning Mass has proved increasingly popular and if possible we would ask that if you have attended Sunday Mass one week then you leave your booking to later in the week for the following Sunday. This gives others a fair chance to book if they have been unsuccessful the previous week. Thank you very much.

A number of parishioners have asked about Mass on Sunday evening, so we are trialling a Sunday evening Mass at 6:30pm, in addition to Sunday morning Mass, on the last two Sundays of October. That's 18th Oct and 25th Oct. Booking for these Masses will open a week before the Mass date. We hope that this will make Holy Mass even more available and help spread the demand across three weekly Masses rather than the current two.

It's really important if you do come to Mass that you leave Church straightaway after Mass. It's really unfortunate but the current Covid rules don't allow congregating in small groups after Mass or staying for private prayer." This is something the Diocese has been very specific on, so please help us with this.

The latest Covid-19 rules from Government mean that the Church must, **by Law**, collect contact details for everyone attending Mass and Private Prayer. This makes it even more important when attending Mass that you **book in advance** please.

If you have a smartphone and have downloaded the NHS Covid 19 app, you can now 'scan in' for Mass. Open the app, choose 'venue check in' and point the phone at the QR code in church until you can see the QR code on your screen.... and there you are!

PAWS FOR THOUGHT: Pope Francis is publishing a new encyclical this week, (Oct 3). 'Encyclical' as you probably know means "circular letter". There is controversy already over the title because its addressed to "men", that's a pity because its really to all men and women! We are waiting to know the contents of the encyclical, which the Successor of Peter addresses to the whole of humanity. But the formulation of the title in no way intends to exclude women, that is, more than half of the human race. On the contrary, Francis chose the words of the Saint of Assisi to initiate a reflection on something he cares about very deeply: namely, fraternity and social friendship. He therefore addresses all his sisters and brothers, all men and women who populate the earth: everyone, inclusively, and in no way exclusively. We live in a time marked by war, poverty, migration, climate change, economic crises, pandemic. Recognizing a brother or sister in everyone we meet and, for Christians, recognizing the face of Jesus in the other who suffers –reaffirm the dignity of every human person created in the image of God.
