When public Mass is resumed places will still have to be booked because numbers will continue to be limited. Booking a 'bubble' of 3-5 people from the same household sitting in the same pew will be possible.

Full details are on the church website, St George's Facebook and WhatsApp group, and on the church noticeboard outside.


