Caring for our Common Home: something to reflect on this month

For the next seven months, the Laudato Si group will be suggesting areas of our lives where we might try to pay better attention to 'Caring for Our Common Home'.

We will seek to help develop an awareness of making choices for the good of the planet and its people, rather than continuing with our comfortable, carbon rich, consumer orientated, planet warming, unsustainable lifestyles!

It has been estimated that if all the world consumed as much as the average UK citizen, we would need 3 planets to sustain us!

So perhaps we can all try to do even small things that make a difference, for example:

- asking whether we really need what we are proposing to buy even if we can afford it;
- buying less; looking for Fairtrade and organic when we can;
- recycling more and buying secondhand (or preloved!).

We are asking parishioners to support St Nicks Environment Centre in recycling some items not recycled by City of York Council. So we will supply recycling bins for:

- 1. spent plastic pens and markers,
- 2. old plastic toothbrushes and toothpaste tubes,
- 3. wires, cables and charging leads
- 4. candles, melts and wax waste,
- 5. coffee packaging.

Above all, let us use our God-given gifts to work together to find solutions to the present climate crisis. As Pope Francis says in Laudato Si, **"Let us sing as we go and find joy in everything we do"**.
