LAUDATO SI WEEK - 19th - 26th May 2024

The theme this year is Seeds of Hope.

Laudato Si' Week marks the anniversary of Pope Francis' landmark encyclical on Care for Creation. The organisers encourage us to "gather in community to contemplate and nurture seeds of hope for our "suffering planet" (LD 2) ... Let us be seeds of hope in our lives and our world, rooted in faith and love."

Laudate Deum, Pope Francis' Laudato Si (LS) update reminds us of the urgency of and the need for both personal and cultural transformation amidst our ecological and climate crises.

Pope Francis writes, "There are no lasting changes without cultural changes ... and there are no cultural changes without personal changes" (LD, 70)

This year's theme ties in with the recent document **Spes Non Confundit** (Hope does not Disappoint) which outlines Pope Francis's vision for the Church's Jubilee Year. The Jubilee Year is called "Pilgrims of Hope" and will run from Christmas Eve 2024 until early 2026. In **Spes Non Confundit**, Pope Francis calls for, among other things, an end to arms sales, for renewed action to tackle poverty and hunger and for the debts of poorer nations to be cancelled as an act of justice.
